

LITURGICAL OUESTION BOX

Q. Can I kneel to receive Holy Communion?

A. This is one of those "hot topic" questions in the church these days. Our older parishioners will remember a time when everyone would kneel at a communion rail to receive the Eucharist during Mass. This stopped being the custom in most places when permission to receive communion in the hand was given by way of an indult, and many pastors had the communion rails removed. More on that later. The straight answer to the question is yes, one can receive holy communion while kneeling. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) paragraph 160 says: "The norm for reception of Holy Communion in the dioceses of the United States is standing. Communicants should not be denied Holy Communion because they kneel. Rather, such instances should be addressed pastorally, by providing the faithful with proper catechesis on the reasons for this norm." We can deduce that the general liturgical norms consider this a question of practicality and personal devotion and do not show any particular preference for either kneeling or standing to receive Communion. In 2008, on the feast of Corpus Christi, Pope-emeritus Benedict XVI, began to distribute holy communion to the faithful on the tongue while they knelt at a kneeler. Because of this, many pastors have provided a kneeler for those who wish to receive holy communion kneeling. In other places where the altar rail is still intact, the faithful have the option to receive kneeling or standing according to their preference. All of this, of course, requires good catechesis for the faithful to understand why we do what we do. Ultimately, whether we receive holy communion standing or kneeling, we must take ever greater care that it is done with utmost reverence and devotion. "By giving the Eucharist the prominence it deserves, and by being careful not to diminish any of its dimensions or demands, we show that we are truly conscious of the greatness of this gift." - Pope St. John Paul II, Ecclesia de Eucharistia n.61
