

LITURGICAL QUESTION BOX

Q. When did receiving Holy Communion on the tongue stop being the normal way to receive? Can I receive on the tongue?

A. Over the last few years there have been many conversations among Priests about this very topic. Cardinal Robert Sarah, the prefect for the Congregation of Divine Worship at the Vatican made headlines a few years ago, when he said in an interview "The most insidious diabolical attack consists in trying to extinguish faith in the Eucharist, sowing errors and favoring an unsuitable manner of receiving it, truly the war between Michael and his Angels on one side, and Lucifer on the other, continues in the heart of the faithful: Satan's target is the Sacrifice of the Mass and the Real Presence of Jesus in the consecrated host. Why do we insist on communicating standing in the hand? Why this attitude of lack of submission to the signs of God? "Receiving kneeling and on the tongue is much more suited to the sacrament itself. I hope there can be a rediscovery and promotion of the beauty and pastoral value of this manner. In my opinion and judgment, this is an important question on which the church today must reflect. This is a further act of adoration and love that each of us can offer to Jesus Christ." This may seem somewhat hyperbolic on the surface, but if we look into what the Cardinal is saying, we must recognize that he is onto something.

In May of 1969, Pope St. Paul VI wrote a letter *Memoriale Domine* to the Bishops of the world speaking about this very issue. In the letter, he did give the permission for receiving communion in the hand, but only as an exception, not as the general practice. What happened was the traditional practice was ignored, and even discouraged, and the exception became the norm. At times, the faithful who would approach the Eucharist to receive according to the traditional practice, were told by their priests that they could not receive that way, and that it had to be received in the hand. This false notion has been taught for more than 40 years here in the United States.

So, the question is this: Which way is preferred by the Church? If we look to our tradition, the writings of Church Fathers, the commentaries of many saints, priests, bishops, and popes, it is obvious that the preference is for people to receive on the tongue. Why is this the case? Fr. Dwight Longenecker gives some very good reasons in a recent blog on his website <u>dwightlongenecker.com</u>

- 1. It increases reverence for the Holy Eucharist
- 2. It is less likely that a non-Catholic will receive communion in this fashion.
- 3. It requires a little bit of humility to stick out your tongue

4. It decreases the possibility of profaning the sacrament by being dropped on the floor, stuck in someone's pocket who doesn't know what it is, etc.

5. It sets Catholic Eucharist apart. Non-Catholic Christians (usually) do not receive on the tongue.

6. It is a deep connection with the tradition of the ancient church.

I agree with his assessment, and want to recommend that this practice of receiving Holy Communion on the tongue makes a greater comeback.
