

LITURGICAL QUESTION BOX

Q. Why do we pray for the dead?

A. Each year during the month of November, we remember in a special way the souls of the faithful departed. We recall that those who have died in God's friendship but are not yet purified from the stains of their sins enter into Purgatory. Purgatory is not quite a punishment, but more of a refinement so that souls may be perfected and enter God's eternal kingdom. We believe that praying for the dead is worthwhile and important because of our belief in eternal life and the communion of saints.

After a person dies, that person's soul still exists. How we live our life determines how we will spend eternity – whether our souls will go to Heaven, Purgatory, or Hell. In the case of Purgatory, we believe that such a state is not permanent, but lasts only until the soul is purified and prepared to enter heaven. We can see evidence for this in Scripture, when Judas Maccabeus and his army pray for fallen soldiers to blot out their sins (<u>2 Maccabees 12:39-45</u>). Because we believe in the Resurrection, we believe it is worthwhile to pray that those who have died may participate in it.

How can we be sure that our prayers for the holy souls will be effective? According to Catholic belief, the communion of saints is "the spiritual solidarity which binds together the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the saints in Heaven in the organic unity of the same mystical body under Christ its head." This means that all the faithful can pray for one another, whether they are in Heaven, on earth, or undergoing purification in Purgatory. This is why we have Masses offered for the dead. We can also offer up our suffering, sacrifices, and various other prayers on their behalf. We also must remember that our loved ones in Purgatory and Heaven can pray for us!

It is not our place to judge if a person is in Heaven or Purgatory or Hell. That is for God to do. We can only trust in His mercy, and offer our prayers for our beloved dead, trusting in the salvific action of Our Lord on the Cross, with the hope of their entering into the Beatific Vision.
