LITURGICAL QUESTION BOX

Q. What are the four last things?

A. The four last things are an important part of our Catholic faith. Every time we come together for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we are reminded if even in a subtle way of them. The four last things are: Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. You are probably wondering how does the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass allude to these? Each time the priest ascends the Altar and offers the Mass, he does so on behalf of the people of God. There is always an intention for the Mass, that is, the Mass is being offered on behalf of a person, living or dead. We begin the Mass with an acknowledgement of our sins, which should remind us of our impending death. Death is the result of sin.

[From **<u>EWTN</u>** - Death is the separation of man's mortal body and immortal soul. It comes to all men as a result of original sin. It is a temporary state, for at the end of the world, all men shall rise again to be judged by Christ. Thus the whole man, body and soul, will be rewarded for the good or evil that he has done, body and soul, in this life.]

After we acknowledge our sins, we ask God for his pardon and mercy. We know that we are guilty of falling away from the way of life that He calls us to, and so we ask to be spared in judgement – **Kyrie Eleison!** When we die, we will be judged by God based on our conduct in this life. This is called the particular judgement. We will then go to our eternal reward, or to eternal punishment. At the end of time, Our Lord will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and God's plan for the whole world will be revealed. His mercy and justice will be demonstrated.

Those who go to their eternal reward enter into the Beatific Vision. Heaven is the eternal state of perfect happiness resulting from the face to face vision of God, which is the reward of those

who have served Him in this life.

Those who are bound for Heaven, but whose love for God is still marred by some imperfection, undergo a temporary period of purification in Purgatory. The souls in Purgatory are in need of our prayers to hasten their purification. When this purification is complete, they are fit to enter God's presence and are admitted to the joys of heaven.

Hell is the eternal state of torment and despair which awaits those who, in this life, have freely rejected God and the happiness which He offers.

In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we enter into the Court of Heaven, beg pardon from God for our offenses against Him, and seek to receive the gift of new life from Him through the graces received in our worship. The Mass reminds us that we are not meant for this world. We will die. We will be judged, and with the help of His grace, we will hopefully find ourselves in eternal Beatitude!
